ENERGY CODE GUIDELINES FOR

HVAC PERMITS

1. At permit application, confirm a Certificate of Compliance (CF1R-ALT02) is included and has been registered with CHEERS.

• If the applicant does not have a registered CF1R-ALT02, provide the Homeowner or Installer a HVAC Title 24 Guidelines card.

2. At final inspection, verify the CHEERS Project Status Report (PSR) is complete.

- View the PSR on the CHEERS Registry at CHEERS.org
- Search for a project by street address.
- Verify all documents are complete. Documents should have green success flags and their statuses are "yes" for all documents.

COMPLIANCE: THE FACTS

Not being Energy Code compliant puts both the contractor and homeowner at risk.

DON'T BE PUT AT RISK!

Non-permitted work may void all insurance in case of:

- Fire
- Roof Damage
- Flood
- Earthquake

Non-permitted work increases risk to:

- Lawsuit
- Sale of your home
- Insurance coverage
- Contractor's license

Failure to follow these steps may result in fines and/or loss of license with the Contractor's State Licensing Board (CSLB)
